Introduction to the ceremony

The ambiance of zeal and intellect could be felt in the crowded Grand Al-Razi Hall, University of Punjab, Lahore, as eminent guests gathered to attend the twin book launching event of latest scholarly works authored by Professor Dr. Iram Khalid on 9th April'2025 "Hindutva: The Truth Behind" and "The Tale of Maharaja Ranjit Singh's Education System in Punjab: A Path to Social Harmony".

The large and interested audience demonstrated the high academic and social importance of the themes covered in the new books. The event started with the playing of the **National Anthem** (10:00 – 10:10 AM,) The

stressed the key need in terms of dialogue and research on South Asian history, education and changing ideological landscapes which was directly pertinent to the two books which were being launched.

As the day begins to take shape, Dr. Hashmi describes the distinct contribution to academic research that Prof. Dr. Iram Khalid's work continues to make on:

- Hindutva and its hegemonic narratives and provide critical analysis of the history and contemporary implications of the ideology.
- Knowledge systems of Maharaja Ranjit Singh, highlighting how the inclusivity policies can become an integrated part of the social harmony and regional stability.
- They not only enrich academic conversation, but merit concerned reflection on the region's socio-political trajectory and their relationship to present day South Asia.

She urged the audience especially the students to make the most of the intellectually provocative content that would unfold during the day. She emphasized that the participants' queries, thoughts, and discussions would enliven the evening and lead to a more profound, more substantive comprehension of the complex topics under study.

Facing us with her description of moderation and insightful introductions Prof. Dr. Rehana Saeed Hashmi had set the scene for the day's events letting the door open to what proved to become a vibrant, multi-dimensioned and intellectual exchange.

Inaugural Session

Welcome Remarks

Prof, Dr. Iram Khaild

The formal part of the program was started by **Prof. Dr. Iram Khalid,** Dean, Faculty of Behavioral and Social Sciences, University of the Punjab, Lahore. She conveyed a warm-hearted welcome to the elite assembly with deep words of thanks to all worthies with expressions of profound gratefulness and humility upon the presence of the esteemed guests: the esteemed **Dr. Muhammad Ali,** Vice Chancellor, University of the Punjab **Prof. Dr. Khalid Mahmood**, Pro vice Chancellor, University of the Punjab, **Dr. Ajit Pal Singh Sandhu**, Vice President Sikh of the Sikh Heritage Eductation and Cultural Association America (SHECA) and **Dr. Gurindar Singh Grewal,** President, Sikh Heritage Education and Cultural Association of America and many other distinguished guests.

Finally, with passion and great clarity, Dr. Khalid presented her two thoroughly researched books. In this conversation, we begin with her plunge process into 'Hindutva-The Truth Behind', how and why she wrote this book from every aspect to understand the core of the ideology of Bhartiya Janata Party (BJP) and its wider offensive and influence on India's secular polity. She emphasized its careful tracking of the historical path of Hindutva, its consideration of contentious policies, and its detailed examination of the 2024 Indian general elections.

Dr Khalid then presented "The Tale of Maharaja Ranjit Singh's Education System in Punjab (A Path to Social Harmony)" a ground-breaking work that traces early educational reforms forges by Maharaja Nankit Singh and their extraordinary impact on social harmony in 19th-century Punjab. The key stress was placed on his policies of all-encompassing rule, as well as on his revolutionary education programme that significantly contributed to gender equality where the vicinity of the town was "unheard of" in developing gender equality also in letters, a vision far beyond the time:

Keynote Speaker

Prof. Dr. Rana Eijaz Ahamd

After the inception of the session, the Keynote speech was given by Prof. Dr. Rana Eijaz Ahmad,

Chairman, of Political Science, University of the Punjab, Lahore. Dr. Ahmad started his address

with congratulations on the academic achievements of Prof. Dr. Iram Khalid and said that he

feels pride in hearing about her work and the depth and relevance of her recent publications;

Hindutva: The Truth Behind and Punjab: The Golden Land of Five Rivers.

Dr. Ahmad, in his address, lauded the academic rigor with which both books were written,

saying that Dr. Khalid's book is a product of detailed research and comes across as a work that

bridges the gap between historical analysis and political reality. "Hindutva: The Truth Behind

us is a welcome intervention in these times which provides important clues for unraveling the

socioeconomic edifice of India and the emergence of exclusionary formations in the name of

Hindutva," he added. Dr. Ahmad pointed out how the book contributes to a much-needed and

timely dialogue of the future of secularism, democratic pluralism, and regional peace in South

Asia.

Having a look at Punjab; The Golden Capital of Five Rivers, Dr. Ahmad thanked the

author for its detailed history telling and profound back ground about the Punjab culture. He

especially praised the spotlight on the rule of **Maharaja Ranjit Singh**, calling it as a great example

of inclusive leadership and harmony among various religions and a model that can teach lessons

to today's political leadership. Dr. Ahmad said the book has successfully shed light on some of the under-researched areas of the history of Punjab, which is why it will be a good asset for both the researchers and students of the South Asian history and politics.

In his keynote, Dr. Ahmad emphasized the importance of original and indigenous scholarship that helps to shape academic discussions, as well as public perceptions, adding that Dr. Khalid's work represents a model of the same. He invited the academic world, especially young researchers, to consult such in depth studies, as well as to help develop a more nuanced, fact-based discussion on regional and international topics.

Dr. Ahmad ended by stressing that both the books are not just timely in the current political atmosphere, but also have scholarly potential longevity and should be read by academics, policy-makers and the general public at large.

Keynote Speaker

Prof. Dr. Mariam Jamal

An enlightening keynote was presented by **Dr. Mariam Jamal**, Assistant Professor,

Centre for South Asian Studies, University of the Punjab, Lahore, and it offered constructive

impressions on the deep academic significance of Prof. Dr. Iram Khalid's contributions. She

praised both books for their erudition and clarity and for bringing to the fore some of the biggest

questions about regional and political transformations in South Asia.

Dr Mariam, in particular, highlighted the relevance of **Hindutva: The Truth Behind**

as a n must read "the book that comes exactly at the time when the world is trying to make sense

of the changed dynamics of India, plagued with identity struggles and intense debate over Hindutva

and hues of secular philosophy. She hailed the book's capacity to delineate the trajectory of

Hindutva accurately, thereby allowing readers to comprehend its political, cultural and social

implications. Dr. Mariam said this work was a significant addition to scholarship as it questions

existing narratives and forces scholars to rethink the direction of Indian politics and the

consequences for the wider region.

Dr. Mariam also underscored the significance of Punjab: The Golden Land of Five

Rivers, calling it an engaging take on Punjab's colorful past and cultural pride. Calling it

beautifully capturing the spirit of Punjab as a region of diversity and determination, she said it

vividly portrays the time of **Maharaja Ranjit Singh** and its plural society. Dr. Mariam commended the book's combination of historical tales with contemporary reflections, lessons of coexistence, leadership and cultural harmony.

In closing her remarks, Dr. Mariam asserted that both texts are important academic works that pave the way for further research and conversation. She urged students, academics and policy analysts to grapple with these books to appreciate the complex political and cultural dynamics in South Asia today.

Guest Speaker

Dr. Ajit Pal Singh Sandhu

Dr. Ajit Pal Singh Sandhu, Vice President of the Sikh Heritage Education and Cultural Organization of America, which is also the **publisher of Dr. Iram Khalid's two books launched at the event**, gave a heart touching speech which was also louder and appreciated greatly. Dr. Sandhu while telling his deep sentiments about visiting Pakistan, expressed that he felt being very at home as he considered himself an integral part of Pakistan's cultural and historical ethos.

He emphasized the need to expose real histories since till date many are unaware of the actual stories and events that have taken place in the subcontinent. He also, with these words, he hailed the writings of **Dr Iram Khalid** and addressed them as indispensable offerings that uncover hidden histories, retrieve the forgotten stories from oblivion that he describes as forgotten palimpsest to the surface.

Dr Sandhu went on blatantly to underline the use of religion for political purposes, pointing out that the Hindutva forces have always attempted to divide the communities by claiming that "Sikhs are the brother of Hindus" and thereby trying to decouple them from

Muslims. That these misrepresentations have helped contribute to such divisions and historical misapprehensions, Fischer characterized as a shame.

"Lastly, Dr Sandhu shed light on the condition of Muslims in India today even as they remain under fear and systemic oppression. He highlighted the prevailing grim situation in Indian Occupied Kashmir and informed that the Indian Army is subjecting Kashmiri people to draconian laws and their fundamental rights and freedoms are denied.

In his closing remarks, Dr. Sandhu made a strong statement saying that everyone has a right to know the truth. He hoped scholarly works such as that of Dr. Khalid would be the main instruments in fostering historical consciousness, mutual comprehension and regional amity.

Guest Speaker

Dr. Gurinder Singh Grewal

Founder of the Sikh Heritage, Education and Culture Organization of America



Recorded in these now-segregated pages of history, **Dr. Gurinder Singh Grewal,**Founder of the Sikh Heritage, Education and Cultural Organization of America, spoke passionately and identified himself as Pakistani, expressing pride in his parentage, his parents being from Pakistan. He said that he had a deep feeling for the land as a Punjabi and it is necessary to know and adopt the rich culture, language, way of living and history of Punjab.

Disagreement, Dr. Grewal said, is not a roadblock, but an opportunity to engage, learn and make progress. He passionately appealed to the gathering to bridge divides, cultivate a spirit of love, and foster understanding for each other among all communities and cultures.

Praising the University of the Punjab as an excellent place for cultural exchange and language learning, Dr Grewal urged students to participate fully in tackling the social issues, to be part of the global links and to contribute to a more peaceful and inclusive society.

He ended by reminding students that the quest for knowledge didn't stop with their diploma. Lifelong learning is indispensable for the growth of the individual, the fulfillment of mankind and society.

Farooq Hameed (Brigadier R) a well-known Defence Analyst presented a befitting,

thoughtful and appreciative speech. He praised Prof. Dr. Iram Khalid's scholarship work, saying

it is national in nature and its recognition should be universal.

He also appreciated the University of the Punjab for playing an unfailing part in promotion

of national integrity as well as academic excellence in the country. "The central idea of these books

was the danger of Hindutva as an aggressive, violent ideology which endangers the secular

foundations of the rights and freedoms of the minorities in India.

He added that this was one of the most effective methods to bring to limelight such

radical ideologies and to spread the values of veracity, consciousness and social unison and

thanked the efforts made in such studies by Dr. Khalid.

Keynote Speaker

Prof, Dr. Farhan Navid Yousaf

Prof. Dr. Farhan Navid Yousaf, Director Institute of Social & Cultural Studies

University of the Punjab, Lahore, read a substantial and academically a complex paper. He also

drew a fascinating sociological picture, skillfully situating Dr. Khalid's output in the broader world

of academe.

Prof. Yousaf underscored the need for such books informing that these will prove

invaluable for modern research in the disciplines of social, culture and political studies. He pointed

out that the books, besides contributing to academic debate, also provide informed views to

decipher the intricacies of complex social systems and power relations in South Asian society.

In his address, he urged scholars and students of ICSSR to critically produce, and

engage with, literature that questions prevalent narratives and furthers a more nuanced, inclusive

view of what animates regional proliferation.

The formal addresses concluded with esteemed remarks from the event's dignitaries:

Guest of Honor

Prof, Dr. Khaild Mahmood Pro Vice Chancellor University of The Punjab

Prof. Dr. Khalid Mahmood, Pro-Vice Chancellor, University of the Punjab, Lahore, gave a thoughtful & inspiring speech. What one should really focus on, he said, is not Hindu majority, or minority of other denominations "but the recurrence with which such narrow-mindedness is prevailing and getting rooted among the people." There might be extremists everywhere, what's worryingly different now is the increasing normalization of Hindutva in present-day India," Prof Mahmood notes. "They were on the Hindutva track vis a vis no Muslims should live in India, convert or get out with the support of RSS and Shiv Sena, he ramped up the narrative to an extent that has never been seen before.

Looking at history, he said that while Muslims and Hindus have lived side by side under Muslim rule for centuries, never before has there been so much mutual bitterness. But the current revival of religious extremism, he cautioned, insures that India's social and political decay will continue unabated. He categorically said that the foundation of Hindu nationalism was not tenable as a basis for political rule and emphasized the importance of the role of educators and academicians as harbingers of the world conscience to stop the spread of such pernicious ideas.

Prof. Mahmood concluded on a positive note, citing history again and pointing out that Maharaja Ranjit Singh, who ruled for 40 years, set up 18 girls' school in Lahore alone in the 19th century, which showed a progressive and inclusive mindset and a key challenge for present leaders.

Chief Guest

Prof, Dr. Muhammad Ali

Vice Chancellor

University of The Punjab

Dr. Muhammad Ali, Vice Chancellor University of the Punjab, Lahore, made a

forward-looking statement. He started by emphasizing the message of Baba Guru Nanak, and

cited his unwavering quest throughout his life for peace, brotherhood and respect among all in

the area. Referring to the ideology of Hindutva, Dr Ali was of the opinion that it is natural and

appreciable to love one's religion, but this Hindutva is not about religious pride; it is about

exclusion, about being in power. With the political rise of the BJP, which has actively pushed

this politics of division, the ugly visage of Hindutva has come to the fore, he said.

Dr Ali insisted that politics must always be based on ideology, public welfare, and

serving humanity and never on hate or religious bigotry. The Sikh community is "dearer to us

than ourselves," he said in loving words about this community and its high status in Pakistan.

He also lauded the educational ideals of **Maharaja Ranjit Singh** to create an inclusive society

through education especially for women.

In his concluding remarks, Dr. Muhammad Ali thanked Prof. Dr. Iram Khalid

for her academic contributions, partner organizations and government for cooperating to make

the book a success as well as the students and people interested in Comparative Religious

Studies, Peace Building and Interfaith Harmony for critical implication.

Following the insightful speeches and engaging presentations, the books *Hindutva: The Truth Behind* and *The Tale of Maharaja Ranjeet Singh's Education System in Punjab* were graciously presented as gifts to the distinguished speakers and honored guests. This thoughtful gesture symbolized appreciation for their valuable participation and encouraged further reflection on the critical themes explored in the books. After the speech presentations a tea break take place, in which all the guests have an opportunity to refresh themselves and have an informal chat together. This lull created a space for the cultivation of collegiality and reflection already underway as attendees started to talk, sharing their ideas and impressions with each other, and reaping the fruits of the intellectual discourse thus far.
